### STOCK FIRES BURNED OVER 19,000 ACRES IN STATE

During 1921, an area of 19,000 acres was burned over by forest fires in Connecticut, doing damage to property conservatively estimated at \$70,000, according to a report given out Wednesday by the State Forester, Austin C. Austin.

At a meeting of the state forester's office in Hartford, many of these fires were discussed. It was the aim of the department to keep all fires that burned over within an area of 100 acres of the month.

The plan in mind, a plan was suggested by Mr. Hawes for the appointment of additional fire wardens in the various smaller territories. These wardens could cover conveniently, this year, with the approval of the fire department.

The appointment of these men was approved by the legislature. The state has enough equipment to supply additional wardens and at the same time have equipment in the hands of the fire wardens who will be in the field.

The equipment secured by the state is a "single" forestry spray pump and is to be used to every fire that occurs. The pump is used to spray the underbrush or what is known as the "fuel" in order that the fire will not spread. This is the first time that such equipment has been used in the state.

The pump will be paid \$10 per acre, and the expenses they may incur while they are in the field will be paid at the rate of 25 cents an hour for the pump and 12 cents an hour for the man. These wardens are also authorized to call on all the landowners in the area of the fire and to collect the money for the pump and the man.
