Madrid, Jan. 18 (By the A. P.)—Spain was almost without telegraphic communication today on account of a violent wind storm during last night, accompanied by a very heavy rain and sleet. Railroad tracks were damaged in many parts of the country, and mail trains were delayed for several hours, especially those from the northern part of the country.

At the same time Barcelona was swept by a terrific hurricane.
