New York, April 6.—The statement of condition of the Federal Reserve Bank of New York, at the close of business, April 5, shows: Total gold reserves \$1,115,907,559.12. Washington, April 6.—The conference report on the navy radio bill which would extend until 1925 the time in which the government lines would be permitted to handle press and commercial messages was agreed to today by the house, after adoption by the senate it will be ready for the president's approval.

FARMERS BUY FERTILIZER THROUGH CO-OPERATIVE POOL. The co-operative fertilizer pool which was organized through the effort of the New London county farm bureau last fall to again proving a big success. At a meeting held last fall, A. E. Sheild, the manager of the Preston exchange, was chosen manager of this pool, and all exchange managers and local buying agents in any communities of New London county could place with Mr. Sheild orders for fertilizer materials. During the winter a number of meetings have been held in different localities at which the crop specialist from Connecticut Agricultural college and the county agent have pointed out the value of buying raw materials and home mixing. As a result of this work Mr. Sheild reports that approximately 80 per cent. of the 700 tons which will be ordered through this pool will be bought in the form of raw materials. The prices on mixed which were also secured were exceptionally good.

MAY PROHIBIT HUNT FOR PLEISTOCENE MONSTER. Buenos Aires, April 5. (By The A. P.)—Professor Clement Onelli, director of the Buenos Aires Zoo, who organized the expedition which left Patagonia March 23 in search of the reported pleistocene monster, was disturbed today by despatches from Trilser, the principal town of the Province of Tucuman, saying Governor Franconi of the province has given orders forbidding the capture of the beast. The despatches said the governor acted on instructions received from the minister of the interior in Buenos Aires, who had decided to prohibit the hunt at the behest of Dr. Albarraquin, president of the Argentine Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals. Professor Onelli called upon Minister of the Interior Genes this afternoon to protest against the order. "In the name of science."

STATISTICS BY LASKER ON PRIVATE MERCHANT MARINE. Washington, April 6.—Establishment of a privately owned merchant marine through government aid, as proposed by President Harding and the shipping board would necessitate a maximum treasury outlay of \$52,000,000 annually, agents and house committees considering the ship subsidy bill were told by Chairman Lasker of the board. Enactment of the legislation, however, would put an end, he contended, to the \$50,000,000 yearly loss the shipping board is sustaining in operating its vessels.

The regular monthly meeting of the executive committee of the New London county farm and home bureau was held in the office in the Shannon building on Tuesday afternoon. B. W. Ellis from Connecticut Agricultural college met with the executive committee. At this meeting the possibilities of running a clean-up campaign for membership were discussed. It was brought out that a campaign as put on last year did not reach all of the farmers of the county.

GENERAL GREGOIRE SEMENOFF ARRESTED IN PHILADELPHIA. New York, April 6.—(By The A. P.)—General Gregoire Semenov, anti-bolshevik military leader in Siberia, was arrested at the Pennsylvania station upon his arrival here from Washington tonight by Sheriff Nagle. In the custody of six deputy sheriffs, he was taken to the Waldorf-Astoria hotel where arrangements were underway to have him released on \$25,000 bail. The arrest was made in a civil action involving nearly half a million dollars on an order issued by Supreme Court Justice DeLoach.

STATE POLICE SEARCHING FOR STOLEN AUTOMOBILES. Winsted, Conn., April 6.—State Police-men, Cleveland and Allen arrived here late today and searched the places of several dealers in used automobiles in search of a stolen automobile or automobiles.
