NEW STEEL STEAMER ARRIVES IN NORWICH

The all steel steamer Major L. E. Lantieri, recently purchased by the Wilson Line, Inc. to replace the Norland on the Norwich, New London and New York line, arrived in Norwich Sunday and tied up at her berth at Central wharf, off West Main street. The steamer is now in commission and will leave Norwich for New York this (Monday) afternoon.

The Major L. E. Lantieri is the largest and most elaborately furnished of any of the Wilson Line's steamers. She has been operated on the local line. The main saloon is furnished in mahogany and plush, with electric lights. There is also an attractive wash room for ladies, with toilets and large wash room.

Throughout the steamer is a marked air of cleanliness and order. The engine room and boiler room are as clean as a whistle. The steamer has two twin screw type with two engines, combined horsepower about 1,000. Both engines are operated at the same time and run individually.

The boat at the present time is running on a night schedule. It is said that an effort may be made later on to put her on a day schedule as she is used as a whale.

CONNECTICUT LEADER IN POULTRY CULTURE

For upwards of a century Connecticut has been a leader in poultry culture especially in the breeding of pure bred or standard breeds of chickens. It is the birth-state of many of our most popular breeds. That popular and largest of all breeds, the Light Brahma were first brought to Connecticut and to Hartford from England and bred by a Mr. Chamberlain many years ago from which the stock of all the leading breeds in America today have descended, writes W. C. Carter of Manchester, superintendent of the Poultry Department, of the Connecticut State fair.

Light Brahmas were the first bred in the standard issued in 1874 and are now the most numerous of the standard breeds. The black Javas reveals its first appearance in Connecticut from the Isle of Java direct. The Brown Leghorns were first bred in old Myrtle. The Barred Plymouth Rocks were originated by Puggam and last but not least the White faced red cornish were originated in Bristol. The premier breed of all breeds in show qualities and high class breeding, the Rhode Island Red, was developed in Bristol, by George Mitchell.

The leading strain of white wyandottes in the world were developed at Nauvauk, by Fred Williams, now of traffic at all times.

Black Orpingtons were bred to their quality by Richard Barnum in Lime Rock, at Lucknow Farm, South Norwalk, are bred the highest class Buff Orpingtons in America. The Rhode Island Red club of America, with its membership of 5,000 is at Manchester. The Connecticut Poultry Association is a national organization of poultry members. The supply is becoming exhausted. As the weather has been unfavorable for the past week or two, Carmon, Wadell and Bell of Great Neck, N. Y., are being supplied in smaller quantities as the supply is becoming exhausted.

There is expected to be in two or three weeks a fair proportion of the year's crop of the six main last week the market was in a somewhat better position than it has not already been done. Tomato quotations are reasonable as well as those on string beans and corn. There will be a supply of lima beans on the market soon and people should invest in them as well as in tomatoes, beans and corn as they contain nutriment. Potato prices are reasonable and the market is increasing on the market. The lamb market is a little firmer but the veal and beef markets remain unchanged.
