REPUBLICANS AND DEMOCRATS BRING UP FORCES FOR POLITICAL BATTLES

With party caucuses near at hand and the fall election not many weeks distant the political pot has begun to boil. Both republicans and democrats are actively at work lining up their forces and from indications there will probably be several interesting and lively caucus contests between candidates on both party tickets.

There is as much, if not more, activity in democratic circles. It is conceded by prominent democrats of the town that the democratic organization from Norwich will support Fitzgerald for governor. The majority of the delegation, it is felt at the present time, will support Spillane for lieutenant and Patrick F. Sweeney for state central committee man. It is generally conceded the democratic caucus will be held at the home of Mrs. J. Kelly, who is one of two apt to favor Lovernagan.
