BIDS \$181,215.50 FOR PLAINFIELD BOND ISSUE

Harris, Forbes & Co., of New York city made the highest bid for the town of Plainfield 4 1/2 per cent. coupon thirty year bonds, denomination \$1,000, aggregating \$175,000, dated November 1, 1922, sealed bids for which were at the Hartford-Connecticut Trust Co., at noon on Wednesday, the firm bidding \$1,015.54 for each bond and \$181,215.50 for the issue. The bid was accepted.
Other bids were: Eldredge and Co., New York City, \$1,033.80 and \$180,915; R. I. Day and Co., Boston, \$1,027.80 and \$178,845; R. M. Grant and Co., Boston, \$1,022.80 and \$178,251; Putnam and Co., Hartford and Eastabrook and Co., Boston, \$1,018.80 and \$178,250; Lampert, Barker and Jennings, New York City, \$1,013.80 and \$178,975.00; Kissel, Kinnicut and Co., New York City, \$1,002.70 and \$175,472.50.
Selectmen Henry J. Benette, Louis Gendron and Peter J. Chabot, together with Treasurer William H. Putnam, represented the town in the issue of the bonds and the arrangements for the bids, over which the Hartford-Connecticut Trust Co. had supervision, giving its certificate. Interest is payable in the bank May 1 and November 1 of each year up to November 1, 1952. The bank is making a specialty of issuing and certifying town and municipal bonds and is obtaining better prices, it is believed, than are obtained through operations in Boston.
The town of Plainfield had a grand list in 1921 of \$5,873,000. Its total bonded debt, including this issue, is \$190,000. Town notes and orders aggregating \$175,000 are to be paid from the proceeds of the issue. The population of the town in 1920 was 7,526 and the tax rate in 1921 was 17 mills.
