

U. S. MAILS.

PROPOSALS for carrying the mails of the United States from the 1st of November, 1845, to 30th June, 1846...

INDIANA. 3354. From Brookville, by Jennings, Oldenburg, E-nolsburg, Georgas, and Allen's mills, to Greensburg, 20 miles and back, once a week. Leave Brookville every Friday at 6 a. m., arrive at Greensburg same day by 6 p. m.

3355. From Bluffton, Warr county, to Fort Wayne, in Allen county, 21 miles and back, once a week. Leave Bluffton every Friday at 6 a. m., arrive at Fort Wayne same day by 6 p. m.

3356. From Columbus, in Bartholomew county, by Rock Creek, to West Point, in Decatur county, 24 miles and back, once a week. Leave Columbus every Thursday at 9 a. m., arrive at West Point same day by 5 p. m.

3357. From Clinton, Vermillion county, by Indiana Turnpike, to Paris, Illinois, 15 miles and back, once a week. Leave Clinton every Saturday at 5 a. m., arrive at Paris same day by 11 a. m.

3358. From Decatur, in Adams county, by Port Mahon, to Liberty Mills, in Wabash county, 50 miles and back, once a week. Leave Decatur every Thursday at 6 a. m., arrive at Liberty Mills next day by 11 a. m.

3359. From Clinton, in Carroll county, through the great Miami Reserve, to Marion, in Grant county, 65 miles and back, once a week. Leave Clinton every Wednesday at 6 a. m., arrive at Marion next day by 6 p. m.

3360. From Franklin, by Hensley's and Bean Blossom, to Nashville, 24 miles and back, once a week. Leave Franklin every Monday at 6 a. m., arrive at Nashville same day by 3 p. m.

3361. From Nashville, every Friday at 9 a. m., arrive at Franklin same day by 6 p. m. Leave Nashville every Saturday at 5 a. m., arrive at Franklin same day by 11 a. m.

3362. From South Bend every Monday at 10 a. m., arrive at Carmel same day by 6 p. m. Leave Carmel every Tuesday at 6 a. m., arrive at South Bend same day by 2 p. m.

3363. From Washington, in Daviess county, by Edwardsport and Robin's Prairie, in Knox county, to Carlisle, in Sullivan county, 30 miles and back, once a week. Leave Washington every Friday at 6 a. m., arrive at Carlisle same day by 5 p. m.

3364. From Washington, on the Fox river, at the portage of Fox and Wisconsin rivers. 100 barrels of good hard soap, 125 bushels of good clean dry fine salt, 1000 gallons of good cider vinegar.

3365. From Washington, on the Fox river, at the portage of Fox and Wisconsin rivers. 150 bushels of new white field beans, 120 pounds of good hard soap, 1000 gallons of good cider vinegar.

3366. From Washington, on the Fox river, at the portage of Fox and Wisconsin rivers. 100 barrels of good hard soap, 125 bushels of good clean dry fine salt, 1000 gallons of good cider vinegar.

and Measures. A simple and frugal Government, confined within strict Constitutional limits.

No National Bank to swindle the laboring population. No connection between the government and banks.

No public debt, either by the General Government, or by the States, except for objects of urgent necessity.

No assumption by the General Government of the debts of the States, either directly or indirectly, by a distribution of the proceeds of the public lands.

A Revenue tariff, discriminating in favor of the poor consumer instead of the rich capitalist.

No extensive system of Internal Improvement by the General Government, or by the States.

A Constitutional barrier against improvident State loans. The honest payment of our debts and the sacred preservation of the public faith.

No grants of exclusive charters and privileges, by special legislation, to banks.

No connection between Church and State. No proscription for different opinions.

Fostering aid to public education. A "progressive" reformation of all abuses.

specific navy-yards aforesaid, after inspection, and at their own expense.

Bidders must specify their prices separately and distinctly, in separate offers for the beef and for the pork, and each of the places of delivery, covering all expenses and charges.

The department reserves to itself the right to reject all offers from persons who have heretofore failed to fulfill their contracts.

Bidders in one-third the amount of the respective contracts will be required, and the balance in addition will be withheld from the amount of each payment to be made, as collateral security for the due and faithful performance of their respective contracts.

The contractor to deliver the contracts, as before stated, to be forfeited to the United States in the event of failure to complete the deliveries within the prescribed periods.

The parts of the beef to be excluded will be particularly designated in the engineering and other reports.

Persons interested can obtain them on application at this office. Bidders not heretofore contractors are required to accompany their proposals with evidence of ability to perform the contracts.

The names of their sureties, whose responsibility must be certified by the United States district attorney, navy agent, or some other person well known to the Government.

When the proposals are accepted (and none others) will be forthwith notified thereof, and three days over above the ordinary time required for the completion of transmission of the mail will be allowed for them to signify their readiness to enter into contract.

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
