The Bank Officers Declare the Bank to be Solvent and that Every One will be Paid Dollar for Dollar. No inconsiderable excitement was occasioned yesterday by the announcement at the doors of the Capital Savings Bank that it had ceased to transact business.

It has been understood for some time that the bank had surplus cash on hand, and that it was in a position to pay its liabilities. The directors of the bank had been for some time in the habit of paying out of the bank's funds the salaries of the directors and the expenses of the bank.
