WIRE BOOK-SEWING MACHINES. Hugo Bilgram ran a paper at one of the late meetings of the Franklin Institute on the subject of wire for thread, which those machines successfully accomplish, marks the next step forward that has lately been made in book-making. He referred especially to a machine which had been exhibited in operation before the Institute, which acted on the principle of producing a number of U-shaped wire staples, which are driven from the inside of each section of the book through the back, and through one wide or several narrow bands of a strong linen or cotton fabric, whereupon the projecting ends of the staples are clinched over, thus effecting a firm connection between the sheets of the section and the band or bands covering the back of the book. The machine consists of a section at each revolution of the main shaft, and may be run at the rate of 40 to 43 revolutions per minute, and the book-sections, partly opened, being fed by the operator upon a table which is raised and lowered in position to be sewed. The speaker pointed out that the advantages of this method of binding, as compared with hand-binding, were greater strength, flexibility and durability. It was also noted that the labor, inasmuch as one operator, with the machine, was enabled to turn out as much work as five to eight workmen by hand-work. The rusting of the wire staples is avoided by using zinc-plated sections, and machines, it was affirmed, have been introduced with much success in Europe, there being at that time no less than 150 of them in use in England, Belgium, France and Germany, and elsewhere. They have been adopted by the Government binders of England and the United States, with the result of considerably cheapening the cost of binding and improving its quality. The machine binding, it was also noted, had been found to be especially valuable in the manufacture of blank books, and the adoption of machine-work for this branch of manufacture in Germany had already caused a reduction in the selling price of such goods.
