PACIFIC SLOPE FOREST.

Digging in the mud flats near Vallejo for claims proves to be quite a profitable occupation just now among the unemployed, some of them making from \$2.50 to \$5 and \$6 a day.

The average in all kinds of agricultural products is unusually large this year, and the promise of an extraordinary harvest is very flattering.

We have frequently been called upon to make mention of curiosities in the animal, vegetable and mineral kingdoms, but the experience of our Benj. Sabin, brought to us by a wonderful freak of conglomeration which is vouchered for by John McConical, who for many years past has been mining on the north fork of the San Joaquin, and is known in this community as a man of undoubted veracity.

His story is that during the fall-storm of Wednesday, he quit work and went to his cabin, located at a short distance from the claim. Surprised at the fierceness of the storm he stood in the door and watched the hail patter on the rocks, which, much to his astonishment, was something like a fearful crash within a few feet of the door, completely covering him with gravel, dirt and slush.

After wiping his eyes and clearing the mud, John again approached the door and discovered a large mass of ice, oval in shape, which he estimates weighed about two hundred and fifty pounds.

It was about three feet in diameter through the center, and almost ten feet in circumference, measuring lengthways. Mr. McConical called the attention of some other miners to the extraordinary phenomenon, and with their picks the immense body was broken to pieces, the hailstone, if it may be so called, proving solid. We are at a loss to account for this incident, and the formation of ice, unless it be on the hypothesis that in mountainous regions hail is not seldom seen, and then when the upper and lower portions of the atmosphere are in a condition of unstable equilibrium.

In fact, Professor Rey, of the Berlin University, in an able article lately published in the Popular Science Review, says that they are indeed warranted in the general statement that as snowflakes are smallest when formed slowly at very low temperatures near the freezing point, so hailstones are largest when formed most rapidly, and have in general as their origin large snowflakes or snowballs.

CLERICAL WRIT.—The late Bishop Whittingham was not destitute of true humor. He once brought down the house of Commons by saying that he was continually in receipt of applications from Maryland vestries for clergy with very small families.
