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CALIFORNIA LEGISLATURE.

XXIII SESSION-NINETY-FOURTH DAY. (Photographically Reported for the Record-Union by Willis & Stockton.)

SENATE. SACRAMENTO, April 7, 1880. The Senate met pursuant to adjournment, President Marshall in the chair.

Mr. Wiser moved to amend Section 11, line 2, by striking out "not to exceed" and inserting "of" and to fix the amount of tax at one-twentieth of one per cent on the value of the land.

Mr. Johnson said he would not have any objection to the amendment if he believed it to be constitutional. He was not satisfied that it would be constitutional. He was opposed to the amendment.

Mr. Wiser favored the amendment. He did not believe it to be unconstitutional. He favored the amendment.
