MINING NOTES.

The Deadwood mine of Dakota has paid \$175,000 in the past six months.

A cheap quartz mill has been put up at the Old Judge mine, Kelsey, El Dorado county.

Additional machinery, to the value of \$100,000, is on its way to the Witches mines, Montana.

The time for declaring the Low Range assessment delinquent has been postponed until August 7th.

The Sycamore mines, Fresno, continue to improve in appearance and more claims are being located.

For the week ending July 10th, the shipment of bullion from the Utah mine amounted to \$175,607.

Large quartz developments are reported from the Minot Ranch section, seventeen miles from Marysville.

The South Overman Mining Company have levied an assessment of ten cents per share, delinquent August 8th.

The Badger Hill mine, near Cherokee, Nevada county, is in full blast. All hands at work and good prospects ahead.

The Kennedy mine, near Jackson, Amador county, has resumed work and are erecting a new set of hoisting works.

The California Water and Mining Company, Greenwood, El Dorado county, have begun their 30-stamp mill and their reduction works.

The El Capitlan, Wheel Jane and Transmitt mines, Nevada county, have consolidated under the name of the New York and Boston. Capital, \$1,000,000.

Near Summit City, Alpine county, a gold and silver vein of considerable size has been developed, twenty feet deep. At a depth of 200 feet the ore assayed \$600.

The payment of \$240,000 by the Consolidated Virginia this month is the only money several thousand holders have received from the Oreston mines in six months.

The placer mines at German gulch, Mono county, are worked by Chinese and one hundred and fifty Chinese. The season has been late, but the yield promises to be very large.

Charles Waterman, one of the discoverers of the Oreston mine, has made another strike near Dunlap, about four miles from Knight's ferry, far exceeding in richness the first discovery.

The La Plata Mining Company of Leadville will pay a dividend of \$15,000 in New York on Monday next. This is the eleventh dividend, and shows \$175,000 for stockholders. A surplus of \$149,000 will be carried over after the dividend.
