LOCAL INTELLIGENCE.

STATE EQUALIZATION MATTERS—THE TAX LEVY.

The State Board of Equalization was in session all day Saturday and until a very late hour at night, Sacramento county, in a written document, signed by Assessor J. W. Houston and Supervisors Wilson, Basser, Blair and Butler, applied for a reduction of the assessment roll of Sacramento county 20 per cent. It set forth that much of the property of the county is assessed too high; that the assessment roll upon \$25,748,133, which is an increase of \$7,181,071, is too high.
