The Position of Senator John P. Jones

SAN FRANCISCO, September 29th.—The New York World yesterday published a dispatch from Washington, stating, among other things, that "John P. Jones had written a letter renouncing Republicanism. The public naturally attribute it to United States Senator John P. Jones, and it is assumed by the Senator that it is intended for him. In an interview on the subject to-day, that gentleman, who is now in this city, very emphatically denies that if the New York World means to say that any such letter has been written by him, the statement is unqualifiedly untrue. He has not for many weeks written any letter in which politics has been mentioned. I did favor," said the Senator, "the nomination of General Grant for the Presidency by the Chicago Convention, but when the Convention decided the question by nominating Garfield, Mr. Garfield became my choice, and I regard him as eminently fitted for the position. And," continued the Senator, "with emphasis, 'there has been no election since that time when the Democratic party in 1861 resolved itself into the rebel army, more important than the present one, which the Republicans of the Republican party were of greater importance to the welfare of the country.' On the subject of the status of the State of Nevada in the country, Senator Jones said: 'I have not and doubt Nevada will cast her electoral vote for the Republican party.' Referring to the election made in the World's letter to his preference for United States Senator to be chosen by the next Legislature of Nevada, Mr. Jones said: 'So far as the Senatorial controversy is concerned, the stipulation of the letter is that I am not a candidate for either within a day or two ago that I would be a candidate, and we have not yet a positive assurance that Mr. Sharon is a candidate. The Nevada Legislature consists of seventy-four members. Of that number there are at present twelve or thirteen hold-over Republican Senators, and Mr. Jones believes that a sufficient number of Republicans will be elected to make up the number necessary to elect a Republican Senator.'

Obsequies of the Late Mr. Glancey—Something About His Murderer, and Why He Was Denounced.

SANTA BARBARA, September 29th.—Services were held this morning at the Presbyterian Church, for more than a thousand people attended. All the local clergymen took part in the services, which were of a most impressive and impressive.
