CALIFORNIA.

The Congressional Convention—Colored Citizens—Bismarck.

SAN FRANCISCO, October 6th.—The General Association of the California Congressional Delegates sitting in Oakland, this afternoon heard reports from the churches of the State, which were shown to be in a prosperous condition. The subjects of Theological Seminary, Golden Gate Academy, the Pacific, the Congressional Associates and the claims of foreign missions were discussed. This evening an address was delivered before the Women's Board of Missions of the Pacific.

The Convention of colored citizens, which met to-day for the purpose of devising means to obtain a proper political recognition of their race, effected an organization and appointed committees. A resolution was passed endorsing Garfield and Arthur.

About 4 P. M. Wm. B. Barrington, porter for Dickson, DeWolf & Co., and Michael J. McDonald, head salesman of Blake, Robbins & Co., entered a saloon on Halsted street, known as "Billy's Bureau," and called for drinks. While the bartender was preparing them, Barrington drew a revolver and fired three shots at McDonald, killing him almost instantly. It is rumored, as the cause of the act, that McDonald had seduced one of Barrington's daughters.

Political Matters.

SAN FRANCISCO, October 6th.—The Republican County Convention to be held at San Francisco to-morrow, has elected a permanent organization, appointed committees, and without further action adjourned until Friday evening. The Convention was held at the Hotel California, and General Miller for Senator. It is reported that the Convention will nominate a full county and municipal ticket.

SANTA BARBARA, October 6th.—Ronaldo Pacheco and E. D. Wheeler spoke here last night in the theater to a large and enthusiastic audience.

MODESTO, October 6th.—The Democratic primaries in this county on Saturday last, following the election of the county officers, were for member of Assembly, L. C. Branch; Sheriff, A. S. Fulkert; Clerk, J. W. McWhorter; District Attorney, J. M. Miner; Recorder, John McCoy; Treasurer, M. H. Hall; Surveyor, R. E. Robinson; Supervisor District No. 1, T. T. Lannin. A full vote was polled, and considerable excitement manifested in accordance with the aggregate of the returns. It is reported that there will be no election of any of these officers except Assemblyman.

WOODLAND, October 6th.—Hon. Henry Edgerton last evening addressed the largest and most enthusiastic meeting of the campaign in this city. A torchlight procession, numbering over 100 persons, headed by a band, paraded the streets previous to the meeting, making a magnificent demonstration. The orator was welcomed with much enthusiasm, and the speaker delivered one of the finest and most impressive speeches ever listened to. The orator was so well received by all Republicans with new hope for success.

NORTH SAN JOAN, October 6th.—A large and enthusiastic Republican meeting was held here last night. Speeches were made by D. D. Long, candidate for the Assembly of the State of California, and J. M. Walling, Nevada City. The meeting adjourned with six cheers for the speakers and the national ticket.

HOLISTER, October 6th.—The Republican County Convention to-day nominated H. W. Colburn for the Legislature, W. E. Burnett for Sheriff, W. G. Lee for District Attorney, T. L. Baldwin for Treasurer, T. A. Tallyrand for Surveyor, and L. K. Howard for Coroner and Public Defender.

PORTLAND (Or.), October 6th.—An enthusiastic meeting was held here last evening by the several local clubs of the city. The meeting was addressed by Hon. J. N. Dalph and David Goodsell.

Horrible Death at Grass Valley.

GRASS VALLEY, October 6th.—A horrible accident occurred Tuesday night at Grass Valley, whereby a man supposed to be William H. O'Brien, who lived in a cabin near the edge of town, was burned to death. It is not known how it happened, but it is supposed that the man must have been intoxicated, and by some means set his cabin on fire while sleeping. He was badly injured before any assistance came. George Randall, who lives near, was returning home when he discovered the burning building. He ran and opened the door, when out walked O'Brien, enveloped in flames from head to foot. The man uttered no sound, but walked back forth with hands folded. Randall, seeing his clothes still burning, ran and procured some water, which he threw upon the man, who fell to the ground. He remained in a sitting position a few minutes, when he expired. The remains were buried in the city.
