

MINING NOTES.

The Bodie Free Press finds consolation in the thought that stocks cannot get much lower.

With the exception of the Ankeny mine, hydraulic mining has ceased on Sterling creek, Jackson county, Oregon.

New discoveries of gold-bearing quartz are daily being made in Magala and Yankee Hill mining district.

One hundred miners are at work at Top A. T. The entire camp will tip 75 votes. The mines look well.

According to the San Francisco Bulletin, the yield of precious metals of the Pacific coast for the month of August was \$1,775,000.

The Salt Lake Tribune figures that the average yearly bullion output in Utah for the past four calendar years was little more than \$6,000,000.

Another big ditch and gravel mine operation started up lately in the neighborhood of Malheur, Plumas county. A ditch of twenty miles in length is one of the features.

The miners of Swank, W. T., are in fine spirits. They continue taking out nuggets, many of which have been taken out within the last fifteen days, varying in worth from \$1 to \$50.

From present indications the cinnabar mines on the Calapoosia, in Oregon, will be turning out liquid metal within a short time. The new furnace has been completed and turned over to the owners.

Nevada county has 45 stamp mills with 503 stamps and a capacity of 750 tons per day. Of these stamps Nevada township has 153, Grass Valley 180, Bureka 78, Washington 50, Rough and Ready 22 and Little York 10.

It is expected that the completion of the Carson and Colorado Railroad to Walker river will give a new impetus to copper mining in that region. The opening of the road will give the owners of these mines an outlet for their ores.

The Nevada Transcript says: A gentleman who came up from Grass Valley yesterday says that on Monday 12,000 pounds more of free gold ore was taken from the Rocky Bar mine. He says this last lot is even richer than any that has heretofore been taken from the ledge.

Jake Thompson, an old Comstocker, has struck it rich in Sonora. He and his partners found an old abandoned mine there, with a coyote hole of a shaft. They cleaned out the bottom and found a well-defined formation wider than the shaft and carrying iron gold. The mine, which is thirty miles from Magdalena, is paying well.
