SAN FRANCISCO, November 18, 1880. The general business outlook is good. Some increase in activity marked the week's transactions in trade circles. There have been but a few arrivals of deep water vessels. The scarcity in tonnage continues and rates on wheat vessels have stiffened. The current rates are 72s 6d for 754 3/4 for a direct port and U. S. for orders. The engagements for the past week were as follows: Ship Florence, 1,654, wheat to Liverpool direct, £3 12s 6d; ship St. David, 1,096, wheat to Liverpool direct, £3 12s 6d; ship Thomas Reed, 1,988, wheat to Liverpool direct, £3 12s 6d; bark Spartan, 740, barley to New York, \$16; Br. bark Kilminey, 741, wheat to Cork, U. S., £3 17s 6d, re-chartered; French bark President Mabin, 1,654, wheat to Cork, U. S., private; Br. bark West Glen, 720, wheat to Cork, U. S., private; prior to arrival; Br. bark Royal Bay, 1,117, wheat to Cork, U. S., £3 17s 6d, re-chartered. The wheat market has been tolerably lively. At this writing a slight advance is indicated. Choice mill-grade milling wheat is reported sold at 65 cents. Harley is in good demand, for home consumption and export eastward. Oats came freely from Puget Sound, and hence the market is dull. Flour has advanced 5 cents @ 9 in the week. Freight by rail east is a cent higher @ 9, by being 2.
