I find that while many members favor the removal of the debris, not one votes for it, and, in fact, not one is willing to suspend all remedial measures, but they are not willing to arrest the evil. They say to us of this valley, 'We will prevent the application of the debris, but we will not arrest the influx of the injury.' If those in favor of reopening the Act to promote drainage had the slightest sympathy for the sufferers of this valley they would have proposed a remedy by making hydraulic mining unlawful. It is plain that they intend to do up to leave at the mercy of the avalanche of mud. I give it as my opinion that not ten votes in either house can be had to make hydraulic mining unlawful. J. C."
