A BODILY "PICNIC"—Several Persons Wounded.

BODIE, February 24th.—Early yesterday morning a couple of miners, named Dugan and West, out on a discussion over a card game, and in the heat that ensued Dugan drew a revolver, with which he fired at West over the head. Another miner, named Donahoe, interfered and knocked Dugan down with a cane, the three falling on top of each other. Dugan, in the meantime, fired his revolver. The shots attracted the attention of Jack Roberts and Dick O'Malley, two policemen, who interfered and tried to separate the combatants, but were received by a shot from Dugan. Officer O'Malley immediately turned himself loose, and fired at the crowd, prominently, emptying his six-shooter. Several of the bystanders were more or less injured. Donahoe is lying in a critical condition, being laid in the grove, his ball passing upward. He claims that Dugan committed the deed while they were both on the floor. No arrests have been made.
