

News from China, Japan, Siam and the Philippine Islands. The Occidental and Oriental Steamship Company's steamer Gaelic, which arrived at San Francisco Monday from Hongkong and Yokohama, brought the following advices:

JAPAN. The value of the exhibits remaining unsold at the Yueno Exhibition is about \$400,000, and it is said that a project is on foot for disposing of all remaining exhibits, the number of tickets to be 1,000,000.

The post of President of the Agricultural Society of Japan has been accepted by Prince Kitashirakawa. An exhibition is announced to take place in Tokyo from the 1st to the 30th of March, 1922. The exhibits are to consist of rice, wheat, tobacco, beans, oil, etc., and also of agricultural products in other.

A party of Koreans now at Yokohama are viewing various objects of interest. Another party are at Osaka learning certain trades, such as tanning, etc. The news from Korea in the native papers is very contradictory, although it is evident that the party which is favorable to the opening of the country is gathering strength.

In connection with the new Department of Commerce and Agriculture, smaller committees have been established in the different districts. Silk has been in fair inquiry but the stock on hand is small and of poor quality. The prospects of the new crop are said to be good. A large business has been done in tea, and while prices have risen, the quality has deteriorated.

A successful regatta was held at Yokohama by the Amateur Rowing Club on the 21 of June. The principal meeting of the Societe Suisse de Yeu has also taken place. Admiral Leseffsky, the Commander-in-Chief of the Russian Asiatic fleet, is the guest of the Government in Tokyo.

The National Industrial Exhibition in Tokyo has been visited by large numbers of people. It closed June 10th. The construction of the contemplated branch line of railway between Tama and Kaibu, Kanagawa, is to be immediately commenced.

Christianity is rapidly spreading, especially in the eastern provinces, and the converts are most numerous among the women, who abstain from work on Sundays. On the 27th ultimo a steamer of 140 tons built to an order from the Yokohama Tea Shipping Company at Yenchin, was launched from the Hirano ship building yard at Ishikawajima.

During the month of May the total export and import trade in all the open ports of Japan was as follows: Import, \$25,300,000; Export, \$25,300,000; Excess of import, \$1,094,724.

A touching incident took place recently in Tokyo. Yoshimura Shichiro, 23 years of age, employed as a clerk in a branch postoffice, formed an attachment for a singing girl named Chitoko. His admirer became so clamorous that he resolved to commit suicide with the girl. They accordingly proceeded to a restaurant called 'Ujin, from whence they proceeded to the bank of the Sumidagawa river and threw themselves into the water. The bodies were found a few days afterwards.

CHINA. There has been a considerable disturbance in the shape of anti-foreign demonstrations at Peking, in which some 2,000 persons took part. Quiet now reigns at the capital. Rumors of hostile feelings towards foreigners are being put down by official proclamations.

The Hankow and Kinkiang tea markets have opened earlier than was expected. Purchases were commenced at Kinkiang, the market for red tea on the bank, and at May, and the Hankow market was opened on the 16th.

The seventh annual Flower Show at Singapore has been a great success. Coal mines are about to be opened in the northeast of Kwangsi, in the districts of Pichuan-hsien and Ho-hsien, situated on the river known as its source as the Hoshui.

A flood equal in extent to that of 1871 is anticipated at Foochow. Preparations are being made by the inhabitants on the Island of Chung Chow to vacate their territory. A large junk which left Pakhoi recently with some seventy passengers was blown by a score of desperadoes who took passage in her.

With regard to the recent piratical attack on the German bark Occident, the police are unable to do anything until the vessel arrives at Hongkong. The German man-of-war Litta and the Chinese gunboat Chen have gone on to assist in the view to getting hold of the pirates, if possible, but much is not expected of their success.

The Hongkong Mail of May 21 says we learn from Peking that the Emperor has not improved. He has been suffering from small-pox for twenty days, and it is feared that the disease will terminate fatally. The Western Empire was worse, and had over 100 persons to feed her with human milk. The physician has despaired of her recovery, but according to reports she was getting rapidly convalescent. In consequence of the death of the Eastern Empire, diamond-shaped pieces of paper of a sea green color were issued in length and breadth, having the characters "Kuo Fu," meaning the "Nation's Mourning," are pasted over all the native shop-signs, lanterns, etc.
