FREE LIBRARY REPORT.—The following is the report of the librarian of the City Free Library for the past week: Number of books issued during the week, 4,200; of these, there were of fiction, 420; juvenile, 170; history, 16; biography, 4; travel, 20; belle-lettres, 20; poetry and drama, 8; theology, 5; science and art, 22; average number per day, 100; percentage of fiction, 60; percentage of juvenile, 25.
