SOME TEXTS FOR SENSATIONAL DRAMAS IN REAL LIFE.

How a Female Swindler Robbed a Cincinnati Merchant of \$4,000 Worth of Jewelry.

"Of all the tricks, devices, subterfuges, sharp dodges or deceptions I ever saw," said Jeweler J. H. Johnston to a Sun reporter, "I have never seen one so cleverly and so audaciously executed as that of a Cincinnati merchant of \$4,000 worth of jewelry."
