IN THE CHURCHES.

The First Sunday in Lent—Some Sermons Abbreviated.

Yesterday was the first Sunday of the Lenten season, and in some of the churches the services were especially directed to food for thought in Lent. In St. Paul's Church (Episcopal) Rev. J. M. Davis preached from Matthew 17, 1, on the subject, "Temptation." He said that immediately after His baptism "was Jesus led up of the spirit into the wilderness to be tempted of the devil." It was the beginning of His ministry—the preparation for His work. Before He began to preach He wished to bring Himself into sympathy with His people—into full sympathy with their trials and temptations, that He might realize and understand the needs and failings of mankind, and be the better able to minister to their wants.

THE LATE STORM.

The following item relative to the storm is furnished by Sergeant James A. Rowell, of the Signal Service: The storm of Saturday first made its appearance at Olympia and Portland at the noon report of Saturday (25th), and at the night report it was raising from Olympia to San Diego, with the exception of Red Bluff, Sacramento and Visalia, with southerly winds all along the coast and barometer falling. A notable occurrence was the fall of the barometer below the normal height for February all along the coast, showing it to be one of the largest and most extensive of the season. It is estimated that the low mean at Olympia that at any other place, showing the storm's center to be north of Olympia going eastward. The southern limit of the storm reached to San Diego, and probably still further south, and its distance from 19 center on the north side is unknown. There have been a storm and damage done north and south of 1,500 or 2,000 miles.
