POLITICAL. REPUBLICAN Primary and Convention NOTICE.

At a regular meeting of the Republican County Committee, Sacramento county, California, held in Sacramento city, California, July 24, 1882, the following resolutions were adopted, viz:—

Resolved—That a Republican Primary Election in and for the county of Sacramento, be held on SATURDAY, AUGUST 5, 1882.

And that the delegates thus elected assemble in Republican County Convention, on WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 10, 1882, at Turner Hall, in Sacramento city, California, at 11 o'clock a. m.

Resolved—That the object of said Primary Election is to elect delegates to said County Convention, and that said County Convention be held on the premises for the various county offices, and to select delegates to the Republican State, Congressional and District Conventions; to select a Republican County Committee, and to transact such other business as may come before said Convention.

That the hours between which the polls are to be kept open at said Primary Election be from 8 a. m. to 7 p. m.

That the qualification required for voters at said Primary Election, in addition to those prescribed by law, shall be citizens; to have voted for the Garfield and Arthur Electors at the Presidential election in 1880, or to have intended so to vote and the voter has also the vote at that time, and a pledge to support all the Republican nominees.

That said Primary Election shall be held under the provisions of the Primary Election Law.

That the time and manner of the publication of notices of said Primary Election shall be by the publication in the SACRAMENTO DAILY RECORD-UNION and the "Sacramento Daily News," commencing on the 25th day of July, 1882, and continuing to and including August 5, 1882.

That the places for holding said Primary Election, and the names of the persons constituting the Election Board at each of said places, and the number of delegates allowed at each place, are as follows, viz:—

MISCELLANEOUS. JACOBS' OIL. TRADE MARK. THE GREAT GERMAN REMEDY FOR RHEUMATISM.

It is a remarkable fact that there was only one instance of accidental failure in the automatic drop of the Greenwich time ball during the whole of the past year.

It is reported that the Merchant Venturers' Company, of Bristol, England, have resolved to erect, at an expense of \$150,000, a technical school for the use of the Bristol Trade and Mining School, founded through the exertions of Canon Mosely in 1855.

A petroleum pipe line constructed from the Colman territory over the Caucasus mountains to the Black Sea coast, was opened on May 27th. This line of pipe, which is 105 miles long, will be able to transport not less than 1,000,000 pounds of petroleum.

A rail for common roads has been introduced in France. It is imbedded in concrete, and is fixed at the edges with the roadway. From the sides it slopes down to the center, so as to enable the wheels of the car to run on the concrete.

The council of the Society of Telegraph Engineers and of Electricians, England, announces that the premiums will be offered annually for the best original papers in the society on telegraphic or electric subjects, and that the premium will be any one not a member of the council.

Planters in Jamaica, encouraged by the success of the experiments conducted at the Agricultural Station, Kingston, have in a measure ceased to devote their whole energies to the production of sugar. They are now turning to the production of other crops, such as coffee, bananas, pine-apples, mangoes and other fruits, grapes are now grown for export.

A prize of \$10,000 is offered by the French Government to any person who will have a steamship built in France, which will have a speed of 15 miles per hour, and will be able to carry 1,000 passengers.
