IMPORTANT DECISION BY THE U. S. CIRCUIT COURT FOR CALIFORNIA.

Does the State Constitution discriminate
Unjustly Against Railroads? Is the
Power Exercised by the State
Board of Equalization in Con-

decision of the United States Circuit Court
