RELIGIOUS INTELLIGENCE.

Bishop Titcomb, Anglican missionary bishop of Ranong, Burma, has been compelled to resign by reason of a chronic spinal weakness, caused by an accident last year in the Kanan Mountains, in Burma.

The Rev. Thaddeus Salkers, the first colored man ever elected to the ministry of the Protestant Episcopal Church in South Carolina, was ordained recently as a priest in St. Mark's Church, Charleston, by Bishop Howe.

The pulpit-deak used for many years by the Rev. Leonard Bacon in the Centre Church, New Haven, was recently purchased by the Rev. Mr. Min, as pastor of Union Church, Chicago.
