LOCAL INTELLIGENCE.
CORONER'S INQUIRY ON THE MURDERED CHINESEMAN.

Coroner A. J. Vernilya last evening held an inquiry on the body of the Chinese man who was murdered in Chinatown Monday evening. The examination was conducted by District Attorney H. L. Buckley and City Attorney W. A. Anderson.

DEPUTY SHERIFF GEORGE K. RIDER was sworn, as declared that he was the deceased for the first time on the night of the homicide. About 9 o'clock he was on 1st street, between Second and Third, when he heard a pistol shot in the direction of Third street, and heard one crying "Felloes!" He ran up the street to a Chinese restaurant, and found in the doorway, with his body half way out, lying on his face, the deceased. He had a gun-shot wound in the right side of his abdomen, and his under clothing was on fire.

DEPUTY SHERIFF GEORGE K. RIDER was sworn, as declared that he was the deceased for the first time on the night of the homicide. About 9 o'clock he was on 1st street, between Second and Third, when he heard a pistol shot in the direction of Third street, and heard one crying "Felloes!" He ran up the street to a Chinese restaurant, and found in the doorway, with his body half way out, lying on his face, the deceased.
