THE STEAMER POLIKOFF.

We have a fuller report of the disaster on the steamer Polikoff, which occurred at noon, while the passengers were at dinner.

The engine was at the table, and declares that when he left the lower deck the engine indicated 200 pounds, and that the glass was half full. The crown sheet went straight up into the air, and the boiler was hoisted, carrying Johnson, the man at the wheel, high into the air and causing his instant death.

Caplain. Those injured were Davis Lawley, the man at the table, and Turner. Neither the man at the table, nor Turner were seen after the disaster. The steward, Amador Ballou, and his wife, David Sparks, were instantly killed while waiting on the table. The body of the steward was afterwards recovered and is on a raft in the bay, but before it could be picked up was washed off and went to the bottom. Sam Kavanaugh, the fireman, was not seen afterwards, and is undoubtedly killed. S. E. Cannon, a commercial traveler, representing Bates, Reed & Cooley was severely injured, but his body was saved and brought here. Cannon leaves a wife and two children in San Francisco. Samuel Babitt, a stranger, was also killed. He was seated at the table, the engine badly bruised about the head; Miss Estelle Bradish, of Tacoma, Wash. broke; Hannah Price, of Skagit, an old lady, ankle jammed and otherwise hurt; H. G. Kelley, of Skagit, leg broken. One of the passengers, however, slightly injured, while sixteen persons on board escaped uninjured. The boiler, or some other missile, went back through the boat, and tore the wheel into a number of pieces, one sinking and the other floating. Indians and loggers near by went to the assistance of the vessel. The latter carried the two bodies recovered, the wounded and the others, on shore, where they were afterwards picked up by the Polikoff.
