A Jacksonville (Fla.) special reports great excitement there about small-pox. Eleven cases were reported yesterday.

The Mexican President asks Congress to procure for his son-in-law, Don Juan de la Barrera, a steamship to act on the coast of the Gulf of Mexico.

The steamer Prussian arrived at Boston yesterday with 1,000 steerage passengers, the most of whom are "chilled" and "chilled."

The weather reports for the Pacific coast will be resumed July 1st, when the new appropriation for the work becomes available.

Over \$2,000,000 in United States notes and gold and silver certificates were reduced to dust in the Treasury Department at Washington yesterday.

Matthew Arbuckle, the well-known cornet player and orchestra leader, died at his residence in New York last evening of pneumonia, aged 54 years.

The fifty-fourth anniversary of the Brooklyn Sunday-school was celebrated yesterday by the annual exercises of the school. There were 5,200 pupils in the line.

An Austin (Tex.) special says: A span of the full bridge across the Colorado river at yesterday, seventy best of stock cattle falling fifty feet. They swam safely out.

Persons to be granted amnesty by the czar on the condition of his resignation will include civilians exiled to Archangel and soldiers drafted to disciplinary camps.

The brig Deputies, from Buenos Ayres for New York, has foundered at sea. She was laden with hides and ostrich feathers, and was insured for about \$300,000 on cargo and vessel.

The National Railway Exposition opens in Chicago to-night, and in the character and number of exhibits certainly promises to be the most stupendous affair of the kind ever undertaken.

The suit of Israel Weinstein against the Pennsylvania Railroad for \$30,000 for the loss of a leg at Altoona, Pa., in favor of the company, the defendant having traveled on a free pass.

Although the internal revenue receipts have continued very large during the month, the imports have been so light that, together with the heavy disbursements, the debt reduction will be small.

A Sebastopol (Russia) dispatch says: A disaster fire broke out in the Russian Navigation Company's building, yards on the 15th, and destroyed the machinery, models and the workshop for ironclads.

The Secretary of the Treasury has decided that the \$100,000 appropriated for the prevention and spread of epidemic disease shall be disbursed by the Surgeon-General of the Marine Hospital Service.

It is thought in Washington that a Court-martial will be ordered to try Colonel Nickerson on a charge of conduct unbecoming an officer and a gentleman, in the matter of an alleged fraudulent divorce.

Owing to rumors of a duel about the Chief of Police of Memphis, the Chief of Police, Chalmers and McCalloway, of the Appeal. Before a magistrate they were made to give a bond of \$1,000 each to keep the peace.

Dr. NIVY, of an American circus had succeeded in procuring in Siam a sacred white elephant, which was to be placed on exhibition, and preparations had been made for its departure, but he died at Singapore Tuesday.

The special committee appointed to investigate the affairs of the office of the Supervising Architect of the Treasury met in Washington yesterday morning, and organized by electing Acting Secretary New as Chairman.


