TELEGRAPHIC BRIEFS.

The death is announced of Blower Brown, the English pedestrian. Mrs. Sherwood E. Stratton, mother of the late Tom Thumb, died in New Haven Wednesday.

In the Reichstag at Berlin yesterday the bill appropriating 1,900,000 marks for the construction of torpedoes was passed to a second reading.

Augustus Schell died in New York at 3 o'clock yesterday morning. He was 62 years of age.

The water in the St. Lawrence river at Montreal is falling. The ice in the river is breaking up.

Francis Marco Cummins died in Goshen, N. Y., Wednesday, aged 62. He was a Captain in the 3rd U. S. Cavalry.

At the consistory in Rome yesterday the Pope appointed Right Rev. F. X. Leroy Archbishop of New Orleans, and Right Rev. D. B. Cullen Archbishop of Baltimore.

The Deutsche Tagblatt, of Berlin, says: At Bismarck's dinner in honor of the Emperor's birthday, Bismarck greeted Sargent with a courteous nod, but shook hands with the other diplomat.

The traction street railway bill was killed in the New York Assembly yesterday. It permitted the construction of a large number of cable railways like those in Chicago and San Francisco.

Henry S. Church, the defaulting Chamberlain of Troy, N. Y., who left Troy February 4th with a deficiency in his account of \$75,000, was arrested in New York City Wednesday night, and was taken to Troy yesterday morning.

It is officially stated that last year at Ermelenau, a small town of Prussia-Saxony, 403 persons died of typhoid fever, 160 died from cholera. The disease was caused by eating raw pork, which all came from one and the same hog.

Budd has presented a number of petitions in the House of Representatives and Citizens' Association of Sacramento and the Supervisors of Yolo county, urging an appropriation of \$500,000 for the improvement of the Sacramento and San Francisco rivers.

There was a row in the Union Club in New York Wednesday, in which James Livingston called Freddy Gebhardt a coward and a liar. The row was turned away without saying a word.

The first through train from the City of Mexico arrived at Kansas City, Mo., yesterday morning at the Santa Fe. The party drove about the city, and at 1 o'clock the train left for Chicago.

At the Convention of the National Guard Association in Cincinnati yesterday morning the time was occupied in discussing the militia bill now before Congress.

Every member of the California delegation at the Democratic caucus Tuesday in Washington voted with the Randall men against considering the Morrison bill.

Wednesday afternoon five men started from Boyd's Eddy, Pa., in a small row boat with a large circular saw to take to Parker for shipment. When passing over Big Falls, near the mouth of the Susquehanna river, the boat capsized and Hamilton Walker, William Watson and David Fair were drowned.

The committee of Union and Confederate soldiers in New York has decided to hold a mass meeting at Cooper Union on April 8th, in aid of a Soldiers' Home at the South for soldiers of both armies.

The house-painters of San Francisco have organized a "Master Painters' Association."

The amount of tax collected during the past three days is \$5,000. The delinquent tax sale on March 28th will have stirred up tardy taxpayers.

The jury in the case of C. H. Crocker first officer of the ship St. Francis, tried in the United States District Court, returned a verdict of manslaughter.

George W. Conkling of Reno, Nevada, who shot and killed Haverstick in New York, was killed in this city of consumption. The suicide of his sister is said to have hastened the course of his disease.

Articles were signed Tuesday evening by Henry Hays and others, calling for a general strike in San Francisco to protest against the proposed sale of the city to the United States.

An Eastern sharper has re-introduced on the streets the swindle known as the "steep racket," which the police suppressed a few days ago.
