Board of Supervisors.

The Board met yesterday, all the members present. Minutes read and approved. The report of the viewers appointed in the matter of the petition of J. B. Bradford and others for road improvement was read, and the matter set for hearing Tuesday, August 5th, at 10 a. m.

REPUBLICAN CONVENTION.

A Full Ticket Nominated—District and State Delegates.

The Republican County Convention convened in this city, at Turner Hall, at 11 a. m. yesterday. Nearly every delegate was present, there being but about half a dozen absent. The Convention, John Rider, Chairman of the County Central Committee, called the assembly to order. A. J. Rhoads placed in nomination for temporary Chairman Findley R. Dray, and Seymour Carr named Thomas McConnell. The former was elected by a vote of 128 to 17.

John A. Sheehan, L. M. Potter, Frank Lombard and Thomas Stovall were elected Secretaries.

Thomas McConnell moved that a committee of seven—one from each Superior district—be appointed on Credentials, Permanent Organization and Resolutions. Carried.

The Chair made the following appointments:

On Credentials—W. A. Anderson, W. B. Burtis, W. J. Davis, John Couran, Senator Romler, J. H. Burnham and Thomas McConnell.

On Permanent Organization—A. J. Rhoads, A. Abbott, F. A. Smith, M. A. Howard, George C. McMullen, John McConnell and F. R. Beckley.

On Resolutions—R. Watson, Chris. Green, J. E. Turner, Israel Luce, George Atkinson, Joseph Kinney, Seymour Carr, Findley R. Dray was also added to the committee. E. Christie was declared ineligible.

P. A. Johnson, J. N. Tenbrook and Captain William Galt were appointed Secretaries at Arms.

At 12:30 p. m. the Convention took a recess until 2 p. m.

During recess the Committee on Credentials heard argument in the contested election of Blaine and Logan. Grove L. Johnson presented one side of the case and W. A. Anderson the other. After listening attentively to argument on both sides, the committee decided that those elected on the regular ticket were entitled to seats in the Convention.
