Cleveland's First Fortnight in the Presidential Chair.

WASHINGTON, March 15th.—The President is pleased with the first two weeks of his administration. He has been very busy, and he has not been greater than he anticipated, and he now feels that the hardest physical labor of his term is behind him. He has received the greater part of his time in making the acquaintance of the leaders of his party. He has met the majority of the Senators and Representatives, but ignorant of the personal relations of the men upon whom he must largely depend for his administration. He has learned more in the past ten days of the inner history of the Democratic organization in different States than he has previously imagined, and he feels that he can now make appointments with some degree of intelligence. Both sides of the national quarrel have been presented to him, and he has been able to judge from personal contact and information, which party represents the ideas approved by the Administration. To have begun filling offices before he had an opportunity to study the men and women who were to be his associates, would, he believes, have involved the Administration in irreparable error. The President is willing to bear the criticism of those who think he has been dilatory in making changes in his cabinet. He professes to go slowly, and it is better to be criticised for delaying appointments than to be criticised for making haste and perhaps ill-considered changes. The President has made his cabinet thus far, because, with the exception of selecting his cabinet and making two or three minor appointments, he has done nothing. His day has yet to come. He knows it, and is preparing himself to meet the hostility that is always caused in the change of the appointing power. Cleveland has been more accessible to visitors at the White House than any of the Presidents in many years.
