Foundrymen are very busy just now in San Jose. Mining improvements are many at Sutter Creek.

There is \$108,287 47 in the San Joaquin county treasury. Santa Maria is to have an artesian well for five purposes.

A Breeders' Association has been formed in Stanislaus county. Progressive clubs are common in San Bernardino.

The marble works below Oleta, Amador, have been closed down. A coal and iron strike has been attempted in Tehama county.

Oceanside, San Diego county, just now is having a real estate boom. A stream of Mormon emigrants is pouring into the county.

The geological survey parties are at work in the vicinity of Red Bluff. San Benito county is agitating the question of building a new court-house.

The new appropriation of the Glenn estate, filed Friday, foots up \$1,585,000. A Citizens' Committee has been organized at Lodi to rid the vicinity of tramps.

A party are exploring the Salt river canyon for slinked out copper beds. The Santa Ana Herald says the canyon crop will be remarkably short this season.

There is not a single prisoner in the Stanislaus county jail, at Modesto, awaiting trial. The first grapes of the season were sent to market from Senator Buck's 'vacaville' ranch.

Wolves are doing much damage to sheep and calves on Jim Caldwell's ranch, near Cloverdale. It is proposed to start a new German colony on the 100-acre Berry ranch, near Santa Ana.

According to the school census just completed in Los Angeles city about 30,000 inhabitants. Shasta county will hold an exhibition of her various resources at Redding on August 28th and 29th.

West Virginia, Sonoma, has one salmon to every eight inhabitants. Its population is twenty-four. The first locomotive of the San Gabriel Valley Railroad arrived at Los Angeles from Cincinnati.

Chinese peddlers are vending their wares in Eureka. Action is called for by the Committee of Public Safety. The new Percival Roller Flouring Mill at Petaluma will be in operation in two weeks.

It is estimated that Lower Lake has twenty trained snakes. They come up and eat fish when he draws his net. The United States Assay Office at Helena, M. T., is proposing to start a station at the hands of a Government inspector.
