Summary for July, 1886.

The average rainfall for thirty-seven years during July was 3.03 of an inch, the greatest amount being 5.6 of an inch in 1890, and 3.0 of an inch in 1881. There was rainfall on an appreciable amount upon six occasions in July during the last thirty-seven years, and to an inappreciable amount upon ten occasions, and no rainfall in twenty-one of the thirty-seven years past.
