THE YACHT RACE.

THE MAYFLOWER BEATS THE ENGLISH CHAMPION.

The Greatest Yachting Day Ever Seen-Interest of the People in the Final Result.

NEW YORK, September 7th.-This has been the greatest yachting day that New York has ever seen, and another day of glory for Boston, for her latest and proudest product of naval architecture, the yacht Mayflower, has won the New York Yacht Club races, under which the races are sailed.

The contest was eminently fair for both yachts, inasmuch as both the course sailed gave almost all windward work, while the other half was down the bay.

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BULGARIAN AFFAIRS.

Russia's Blow at Prince Alexander Aimed at Great Britain.

By Telegraph. London, September 7th.-The Herald's Sofia special of September 6th says: Prince Alexander refuses to see any one to talk but I spent half an hour to-day with Baron Von Reibell, his Adjutant. He says that the Prince is physically prostrated. He lies down, but the excitement of the present situation prevents sleep. His features are terribly drawn and pinched. He will take up his residence either leaving Bulgaria, at Ingelheim, with his father.

London, September 7th.-The abdication of Prince Alexander is definite. There was no other way out of the difficulty.
