ARREST OF A SUPPOSED MURDERER AND ROBBER.

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The only points of the message that are awaited with great curiosity are those relative to the tariff, the silver, and the national banks, and Democrats who have believed that he will substantially repeat the recommendations made in his message at the first session. On the question of the tariff the message will probably be more emphatic in advocating a reduction of the duties on imports than in his message of a year ago.

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The other way to reduce taxes either by lowering the duties on imports or abolishing, in whole or in part, internal taxes, he did not think it prudent to suggest to the people would warrant removal of the taxes on spirits and tobacco, and at the same time the duties on clothing, woods, blankets, cotton goods and sugar. If the duty on sugar should be removed, however, it was feared that Spain might lessen her export duty on that product from Cuba and that Speculators would put up the price of Hawaiian sugar, so that we would be deprived of revenue, and it was thought he was compelled to say as much for that article of food as they now pay.

The President, however, was inclined to favor the tariff, and he has not yet decided to free the tariff, and as a compromise between Morrison's and Randall's schemes of tariff reform, he has decided to charter a commission and grant sufficient protection upon manufactured goods to cover the difference between the duties on raw materials and the tariff actually known whether the President desires action by Congress on the tariff question at the present session of Congress.
