EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT. SACRAMENTO, March 15, 1887.

Whereas, the Legislature of the State of California, at its twenty-seventh session, beginning on the third day of January, A. D. eighteen hundred and eighty-seven, two-thirds of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of said Legislature voting in favor thereof, proposed the following described amendments to the Constitution of the State of California, to wit:

Section 8. Any city containing a population of more than one hundred thousand inhabitants may frame a charter for its own government, consistent with and subject to the Constitution and laws of this State; by causing a Board of fifteen freeholders, who shall have been for at least five years qualified electors, to be elected by the qualified voters of such city, to prepare and propose a charter for such city, which shall be signed in duplicate by each of the fifteen freeholders, and one copy thereof returned to the Recorder of Deeds of the county in which such city is situated, and the other to the Recorder of Deeds of the State.

Section 2. The Supreme Court shall consist of seven Justices. The Associate Justices of the Supreme Court, in office at the time of the adoption of this amendment to the Constitution, are to continue in office until their terms expire. The Justices shall be elected by the qualified voters of the State, at a general or special election, to be held on the third day of January, A. D. eighteen hundred and eighty-seven, two-thirds of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of said Legislature voting in favor thereof, proposed the following described amendments to the Constitution of the State of California, to wit:
