THE SALMON INDUSTRY

Extending the Columbia Supply—Alaska the Future Source. SAN FRANCISCO, July 19th.—[Special.]—In an interview regarding the salmon market, Mr. J. H. Johnson, of the Columbia River, said today: "The run on Columbia river to the first of July was 70,000 cases, and last year, which was a short year, the run up to the first of July was 70,000 cases. If the same ratio of shortage continues, the day of July will probably be about 120,000 cases. The pack last year was 50,000 cases. SHORTAGE ON THE SACRAMENTO
