The average Signal Service temperature yesterday was 79°, being 7° warmer than the normal for that day. The highest and lowest temperatures were 92° and 61°, with light variable winds during the day and fresh southerly winds at night.

"Ha, ha," said the hammer. "I knew you wouldn't succeed. I'll show you the way." But at the first stroke it flew his head, and the iron remained as before.

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
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Training Birds.
