EDUCATIONAL MATTERS

Changes in the High School Courses.—Recourse to the Board of Education. The City Board of Education met last evening, all the members present except Director Hopkins, who is absent from the city.

Director Slater, of the Furniture and Supply Committee, said he had just completed a tour of inspection of all the school buildings, and found a half-dozen stoves that would have to be replaced with new ones.

Director Edw. W. Cole, Chairman of the Committee on Course of Study, made the following report on course of study in the High School:

Scholars of ordinary ability can complete any of these courses of study in three years, providing they are studious and regular in attendance.

First year—German or French; English; algebra; trigonometry; history; Roman, Grecian, and modern; arithmetic; geometry; composition.

Second year—Latin; Greek; English; algebra; trigonometry; history; Roman, Grecian, and modern; arithmetic; geometry; composition.

Third year—Latin; Greek; English; geometry; physics; composition.

Fourth year—Latin; Greek; English; history; Roman, Grecian, and modern; arithmetic; geometry; composition.
