THE EXCITEMENT IN SAN FRANCISCO. The disclosures in San Francisco of jury bribing, the escape of Creighton, for which the Courts and the District Attorney are deserving severe censure, has led to attempt to organize what would appear to be the semblance of a vigilance committee.

If any idea of vigilance formation is entertained in San Francisco, it should be frowned down at once.

Matters are no worse there now than they long have been. At this time the Courts, the Grand Jury and officials are vindictive crime, and doing well in unearthing crime and punishing offenders.

To attempt any organization that would be likely to develop into a movement to suppress them and put violence in the seat of justice and order procedure, would be outrageous.

However guarded any committee of safety may be, it may escape control and operate to displace the Courts and to subvert legal methods.

No proposition liable to such results is tolerable. It cannot for a moment have consideration from men who have the interests of society at heart.

The idea of a vigilance committee, and its child of unreason and passion, as the San Francisco Call well says, referring to a proposed "Committee of Safety," or a mass meeting: "Better than either the meeting or committee would be a general resolve of every citizen should make it a part of his individual duty to aid the cause of reform at the present crisis, and to do what in him lies to bring knaves to justice."

THE IONE FAIR

THE FIRST ANNUAL EXHIBITION OF THE 26TH DISTRICT.

The first annual fair of the Twenty-sixth District, comprising the counties of Amador and Calaveras, commenced at Ione Wednesday and closed Saturday night.
