The Pool-Selling Privileges Bound Up Like an Off-Repeated Chestnut—Appointments, Etc.

The Directors of the State Agricultural Society held the meeting usually set for this season of the year on Saturday, August 4th, for the consideration of the State Fair and other arrangements incidental to the opening of the fair.

The malcontents, and those who are struggling for patronage more than for the interest or welfare of the Society, made their usual fight about the pooling privilege, which seems to be the only weapon obtainable by those who fail to obtain recognition, for reasons which to a majority of the Board seem just.

Mr. Hancock, in reply to Mr. La Rue's assertion that he had received no notice, said that he had received an advertisement in the Sacramento Daily Union, which was a notice to attend a meeting, and that he had attended it.

Director Cox said that last season he favored the pooling privilege, but that he must say that it was a mistake to give the largest amount of money ever given for the pooling privilege to the pooling privilege.
