THE LOWELL MURDERERS.

The Jury Impaneled and the Examination of Witnesses Begun. The Record-Union's special representative at Placerville sent the following telegram last evening: "The taking of testimony in the case of Myers, Olsen and Drager, for the murder of John Lowell on the 24th of June, commenced at 2 o'clock this afternoon. The jury was completed at the morning session, by the acceptance of George A. New and Thomas Wright, George J. Ingalls has been entered of record, as attorney, to assist in the prosecution of the case. District Attorney Bennett made the opening statement to the jury, reciting the full particulars of the murder. In doing so, he referred to John Seitz, the attorney who kept a grocery, where idle and dissolute persons congregated, and where the three defendants were stopping when they decided upon going to Lowell's ranch, and stealing his horses. He spoke severely of Seitz's actions, and as soon as a recess was taken, Seitz, who is here as a witness for the prosecution, telegraphed to his attorney, C. T. Jones, to come up and be present at the examination."

THE NEW YORK MARKET. The same publication says of the New York market: "There is a little to be said this week to what we reported last, the same general features prevailing now as when the market was first opened. The outlook is most unfavorable for the crop, and the London market has advanced another point. We cannot call prices higher here, but can say that last week's advance has been fully maintained. There has been some call for export, but not enough to add strength to the market; in fact the positive character of shippers is extremely scarce, and this restricts the movement. As stated in our issue of the 24th inst., the market has been made up in the interior at fifteen cents, but it is found this week that growers generally are less willing to close at this figure, and are asking more money. The future is still a question, but the new crop is likely to open at or near twenty cents makes the grower loth to contract at much below this figure; besides, there is yet another week or ten days for the hops to remain upon the vine, during which time changes may take place. We think the English crop is not so good, and that what may be gained in the market will be lost in quality, for there seems to be no let up to the bad weather over there."
