HUNTERS' PARADISE

SPLENDID SPORT AT THE HEAD OF CAPAY VALLEY.

A Party of Sacramentans Among the Deer, Quail, Wild Pigeons and Other Game.

The recent extension by the Southern Pacific Company of the Woodland, Capay and Clear Lake Railroad from Madison to Rumsey, at the head of Capay valley, has made it possible to reach within a few hours from San Francisco or Sacramento, the finest hunting grounds in the State.

The party, for game of almost every variety, including quail, wild pigeons, ducks and smaller game. The present terminus of the railroad, Rumsey, is situated at the head of Capay valley, where the mountains are in the distance and the valley opens up to the east.

The party, consisting of Judge S. C. Benson, Frank Miller, N. E. White, Wm. H. Hamilton, E. H. Willis, J. M. Morrison and Dr. C. A. Wilson of Sacramento, and Dr. E. L. Eklon, of Colusa, started for the mountains on Sunday night, having secured four deer and an immense amount of quail and other small game.
