CONGRESSIONAL PROCEEDINGS.

WASHINGTON, January 18th.—In the Senate today, the President's message, returning without approval the bill for the relief of William R. Wheaton and Charles H. Chamberlain, Register and Receiver of the Land Office at San Francisco prior to 1887, was read.

The Senate then resumed consideration of the tariff bill, by the amendment reported from the Finance Committee, allowing a bounty of one cent per pound on sugar produced from beet sugar and cane sugar grown in the United States.
