

SOMETHING FOR NOTHING.

MRS. SMITH'S STORY OF HER SWAP WITH HARLOW.

How She Came to Part with Her El Dorado Property—A Deed that Does Not Materialize.

The examination of W. P. Harlow, charged by Mrs. Martha E. Smith with obtaining property by false pretenses, came up before Justice Devine yesterday afternoon.

THE ROCKING RANCH. The objection was overruled, and witness went on to say that she met Harlow in this city in February last and informed him that her property was to be swapped.

THE NEXT DAY HARLOW CAME TO THE RANCH, but did not bring the deed. He paid \$100 for attorney's expenses and the property was turned over to him.

FOUR WEEKS LATER WITNESS MET HARLOW and asked him for the deed. He said the property was in litigation, and that he could give no deed.

PROPERTY WORTH UPWARD OF \$8,000. On cross-examination witness told her affairs in El Dorado county, and said she owed \$8,000 on her two farms, comprising 400 acres.

OTHER WITNESSES HEARD. George H. Smith was next placed on the stand. He is the present husband of the complainant, and was with her on the trip to Placer county, and when the deeds were delivered to Harlow in Hughes' office.

ON CROSS-EXAMINATION EACH TESTIFIED that Harlow said the property was in litigation with the railroad, and that he might give evidence which would be in his favor.

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HEALTHY TOWNS.

A MARKED REDUCTION IN STATE MORTALITY.

The Lowest Death Rate of any State in the Union—Infant of Consumption—Etc.

Dr. Tyrrell, Secretary of the State Board of Health, has issued his report for March, from which the following extracts are made:

Reports of mortality received from seventy-four localities, with an estimated population of 74,500, give, in the aggregate, 507 deaths, which is a percentage of 1.24 per thousand in the month, or an annual death rate of 14.88 per annum.

It is desired that all citizens who feel inclined to contribute to the fund do so as early as day possible, in order that a timely start may be made in the matter.
