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CITY WATER. COMPARISONS BETWEEN OLD AND NEW RATES.

The Changes Affect Families Very Slightly—How the Old Ordinance Has Been Evaded.

Since the passage by the City Trustees of the new ordinance regulating water rates it has been the subject of general discussion throughout the city...

Under the old ordinance laundries employing four or more persons have paid \$7 per month. As a matter of fact, however, they have paid the proper proportion of the tax...

The increased rate for water used for family or household purposes is very small, as a comparison of the old and new ordinance will show. Heretofore the rate charged, or supposed to be charged, for families of four or more persons was twenty-five cents each per month...

Expected to be derived from the operation of the new ordinance is the sum that will be collected from a certain class of the floating population—those who change their residence every two or three months...

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
