The Elegant Decorations of New York for the Inaugural Celebration To-morrow.

NEW YORK DECORATIONS.

Some of the Principal Features-Description of Arches.

New York, April 28th.-The usual quiet of the Sabbath was broken yesterday by workmen putting up decorations along the proposed line of march of the great centennial parade. The rains for the past two days had put a stop to all work on decoration, and when the clouds began to break away work was resumed with a momentary loss of time. The chief interest seemed to center at Washington square at the end of the street, where the first great arch stretches from curb to curb. The arch is built entirely of wood and is ornamented with a profusion of garlands and wreaths in paper mache. It is painted white and is surmounted by a carved wood statue of Washington, ten feet high. This is the statue which has been first erected on the battery in 1792. At the foot of the statue is a large trophy of national flags and from the four corners of the arch streamers are extended to the corners of the neighboring residences. A large trophy of flags appears on each side and upon either keystone is perched a fine specimen of the American eagle. The arch is also being decorated with electric lights, and is lighted up with the most beautiful appearance.

The First Presbyterian Church, between the arch and the street, will be utilized for an immense stand, and the Presbyterian building on the other side of the street will be used for a similar purpose.

Up at the corner of Fourteenth street the grand armory first attracts attention with its flags and banners, each window and flag pole up to every sill.

The large Hanover apartment house, on the corner of Fifteenth street, is handsomely decorated.

At the corner of Twenty-first street the South Reform Church yard is filled with stands.

The Union Club is beautifully decorated. Nothing was done to-day toward the completion of the decoration of the arch at Twenty-third street, but it is said that four hours will suffice to transform it from its present appearance into a veritable picture of lightness and brilliancy.

Looking through the arch one first sees four golden eagles in the midst of trophies on flags that project from a window on the corner of the Albernier Hotel. The same ideas are being carried out in the ornamentation of the Broadway and Twenty-fourth street sides of the arch, and the effect is very pretty.
