ADMISSIBLE APPOINTMENTS.

Good Men Named for Different Offices by the President.

WASHINGTON, June 21.—The appointments made by the President to-day seem to give general satisfaction to all parties, unless it be the disappointed candidates. In the Consular service the promotion of Frank Mason of Ohio, from Consul at Marietta to Consul General at Frankfurt, is generally commended. Secretary Blaine considers him to have been the best Consul in the service.

William C. Goodloe, appointed Collector of Internal Revenue in Kentucky, is one of the best known men in the blue grass country, and has been a consistent and energetic worker in the Republican party since its inception. He was endorsed for the position by the leading Republicans of Kentucky, and his appointment gives universal satisfaction.

RIOTING IN BOHEMIA.

The Rioters Burning the Municipal and Private Property.

VIENNA, June 21.—The striking miners at Klado, Bohemia, engaged in a riot on Thursday night. The gendarmes fired on the rioters, killing and wounding twelve. Further trouble is feared. Three battalions of troops have been sent to the scene.

It dispatches to-night from Klado report the rioting still going on. The mob wrecked the municipal buildings and the law courts and liberated a comrade who had been arrested. The rioters then invaded the residence of the Director of the mines. Some of the occupants were driven from the house while others barricaded themselves in a bedroom.
