Auspicious Opening of the Twenty-sixth District Exposition.

The first race, a running stake for all ages, three-quarters of a mile and repeat, was won by a field horse that paid \$22 to \$1 in the track.

The Pavilion was formally opened Tuesday night by an address by the Association President, V. S. Gregory.

The display presented did not essentially represent the resources of the district territory, and most unmercifully scored a class who, by sheer negligence, permitted the exhibit to be either shabby and shoddy, or stand back and critic the exhibit and kick at the management.

The display, although meager, presents many attractive features, and is worthy of comment that the local exhibits were all in place in time for the opening.

A stage occupied one end of the Pavilion, in front of which excellent seating arrangements have been made, and a pleasing programme is rendered each evening.

For the past four days the arriving trains, although running, have been loaded with visitors, and the streets present a lively appearance.

The attendance, for the past few days, has been large, both at Park and Pavilion. The trade is excellent and all races close and interesting.

The first race on the track was the running stake for two-year-olds, five-eighths of a mile dash, won by Kelly & Samuels.

The second event—running stakes for all ages, five-eighths of a mile, with eight starters—was as pretty a contest as possible.

The trotting purse, 2.27 class, did not fill, and a 600-yard and repeat saddle-horse race was substituted, and won by Ben Dean's Harrison in straight time.
